Dayton to Host Pro-Life Science and Technology Symposium

The inaugural Pro-Life Science and Technology Symposium will be held on May 1 at the Dayton Engineer's Club. The goal of this conference is to provide a forum for scientists, engineers, and other technical specialists who seek to use their skills to promote the right to life. It is different from other technical conferences in that it focuses specifically on applications of science and technology to the pro-life movement. It is different from other pro-life conferences in that speakers do not need to accommodate their presentations to a general audience: the instructions to speakers specified that they should "assume that the audience is technically sophisticated, but not necessarily in your field".

The keynote speaker will be Father Frank Pavone of Priests for Life. Presentations topics will include stem cell research, analysis of abortion statistics, and uses of internet and database technology.
